As a Chapter Membership Team, you should encourage all members to speak positively (don't assume it is just new members who may have trouble explaining what the Royal Arch is).

Taking the skills you have developed in your Lodge, build your statement as to 'what benefits/pleasure you get from being a member of your lodge, now look at how you can use similar language to explain to Brethren about Royal Arch Chapters.

Why Join & Discover More are two functional support materials, and no matter how experienced a Companion you are, utilising the resources in the Engage Hub, which relate to further learning and mentoring about the Royal Arch (including the Welcome Companion Booklet), will ensure the basis of your knowledge is enhanced.
